

# COMPENDIUM OF ACHIEVEMENTS OF PROFESSOR IBIYEMI IBILOLA OLATUNJI-BELLO'S ADMINISTRATION IN HER 1ST YEAR IN OFFICE

#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Governor of Lagos State and Visitor to the Lagos State University, Mr. Babajide Olusola SANWO-OLU, on Friday, 17th September, 2021 pronounced the appointment of Professor Ibiyemi Ibilola OLATUNJI-BELLO, mni, as the 9th Substantive Vice Chancellor of the Lagos State University.

Professor Ibiyemi Ibilola OLATUNJI-BELLO's Administration commenced on 20th September, 2021 with a vision to make Lagos State University (LASU) the best University in West Africa. She took over from Prof. Oyedamola OKE, the Acting Vice Chancellor (January 2021 – September, 2021).

#### 1.1 BRIEFPROFILE

An astute academic, Professor Olatunji-Bello, prior to her appointment as VC rose through the ranks from Assistant Lecturer (1988-1991), Lecturer II between 1991 and 1996, Lecturer I from 1996 to 1999, Senior Lecturer (1999 - 2005), Associate Professor between 2005 and October 1, 2007, all in the College of Medicine of the University of Lagos, Idiaraba. She assumed duty as the First Professor of Physiology in

Lagos State University College of Medicine on the 2nd of October, 2007

She also held several professional and administrative positions both at UNILAG and LASU. Until her election as the First female Deputy Vice Chancellor of

LASU, she was the First substantive Head of the Department of Physiology, LASUCOM. Other University managerial positions held by Professor Olatunji-Bello include: Acting Vice Chancellor (July –December 21, 2010, January 30 - October 31st, 2011). Deputy Vice Chancellor (Dec 2008 to December 2010) Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), LASU (November 2011- January 2013 Head, Department of Physiology, LASUCOM (October 2007 to December 2008) Pioneering Director of LASU Directorate of Advancement.

She is a member of many professional bodies and she was the first female Second Vice President, Physiological Society of Nigeria, and the First Vice President, also first female to hold that position up to year 2019.

Prof Olatunji-Bello was Government representative on the Lagos State University (LASU) Governing Council, 2004 to October 2008 and a Senate Representative on the Governing Council of Lagos State University until her appointment as the Second Female and 9th Substantive Vice Chancellor of the Lagos State University by the Governor of Lagos State and Visitor to the Lagos State University, Mr. Babajide Olusola Sanwo-Olu on Friday 17th September, 2021.

#### 2.0 SIX STRATEGIC GOALS/ROADMAPS OF THE ADMINISTRATION

The Prof. Ibiyemi Olatunji-Bello's Administration took off on 20th September 2021 with a vision to make LASU the best University in West Africa. To achieve this vision, the Administration set out six strategic goals/roadmaps as follows:

- \* To ensure that Academic and Professional Programmes are and remain accredited by the relevant bodies;
- \* To make the University a research, innovation and development hub for Lagos State and National development;
- \* To ensure that infrastructural facilities are improved and readily available for seamless performance of Administrative and academic duties;
- \* To improve Internal Generation of Revenue with the aim of achieving financial sustainability of the university;
- \* To promote the welfare of all Staff and Students in the University;
- \* To promote participation in Sports and Recreational Activities



#### 3.0 HIGHLIGHTS OF ACHIEVEMENTS

One year down the lane, the Administration, with supports of all Stakeholders in the LASU project, has achieved modest feats highlighted under the following strategic goals/roadmaps:

# 3.1 GOAL 1: ACCREDITATION OF ACADEMIC AND PROFESSIONAL PROGRAMMES BY RELEVANT PROFESSIONAL BODIES

Within the first three months of her Administration, the National Universities Commission (NUC) and relevant Professional Bodies conducted accreditation exercise on 37 Programmes with the following results:

31 among the 37 programmes put up for accreditation by NUC received full accreditation, translating to 96% full accreditation of programmes. It was an unprecedented pass rate for any

sitting Vice Chancellor in Nigeria, in the first year in office.

100% Accreditation Status in all Professional Accredited Programmes including the LASU MBA flagship programme.













- 3.1.2 Other Academic Developments Closely related to the accreditation of programmes, the Administration also made significant progress in exploring new areas of knowledge:
- 3.1.2.1 Secured approval to establish three (3) new Faculties and one (1) School: In a bid to expand existing undergraduate academic programmes and to provide more opportunities for admission seekers in the University, the Administration initiated and accomplished the establishment of three (3) new Faculties and concluded the establishment of one (1) School. Within the first year of the

Administration, approval has been secured from the Governing Council and Senate of the University to establish and run the following Faculties and School:

Faculty of Allied Health Sciences;

Faculty of Pharmacy;

Faculty of Environmental Sciences

School of Library, Archival and Information Science which is the first in West Africa and Second in Africa. Currently, the Faculties and School are at various stages of take-off, with pioneer Acting Deans appointed to midwife the commencement of studies.








#### 3.1.2.2 Expansion of Programmes at the Epe Campus:

The Administration has introduced additional programmes to the Epe Campus: the following new programmes will domicile in the newly established Faculty of Environmental Sciences: Civil Engineering as well as Industrial and Systems Engineering.

#### 3.1.2.3 Admission of new International Students:

The University, earlier in 2022, attracted seven new international students from Ghana to the

Africa Centre of Excellence for Innovative STEM Education (ACEITSE) 9 postgraduate programme. In order to make their stay comfortable, the Administration provided a comfortable accommodation for them at the Senior Staff Quarter in the main Campus, Ojo.





3.1.2.4 The Administration secured approval to mount Nine (9) additional courses for the Africa Centre of Excellence for Innovative STEM Education (ACEITSE) under 1. B.Sc Degree Programme viz:

B.Sc (Ed) Educational Management,

B.Sc (Ed) Computer Science Education,

B.Ed (Business Education) and

B.A. (Ed) English Education,

Mass Communication;

Transport and Logistics;

B.Sc History and International Relations;

B.Sc Music; and

B.Sc Nursing subject to 2021/2022 Accreditation Exercise by the National Universities Commission (NUC) and approval from the relevant stakeholders;

#### 3.1.2.5 Procurement of Additional Library Books:

The University Library, which had consistently had an average of 2,500 additional volumes of books per year since inception in 1983, acquired almost 4,000 volumes of books within six (6) months of inception of this Administration. The University also subscribed to seven (7) different electronic databases for all round learning, this is unprecedented with four (4) for Law Programme alone.

3.1.2.6 the University graduated the first Ph.D. in Housing and Urban Development in Nigeria.

3.1.2.7 the University secured 5 years Full Accreditation for Masters in Urban and Regional Planning [MURP] Programme by the Town Planning Registration Council of Nigeria in January 2022. 3.1.2.8 under the Administration, the University recorded the highest number of First-Class

Graduates ever in a single (2020/2021) academic session.

3.1.2.9 the Best Graduating Student (Benjamin Olowu) with the highest CGPA ever was also recorded in the first year of the Administration

- 3.1.2.13 Provision of 150 KVA Brand New Diesel Generator
- 3.1.2.14 Installation of 32 CCTV Cameras and other Security and Information Communication Gadgets in ail lecture theatres
- 3.1.2.15 Provision of Scanners/Fingerprint Scanning Machines for biometric verification
- 3.1.2.16 Provision of a Bus for JUPEB Library use

# 3.2 GOAL 2: TO MAKE THE UNIVERSITY A RESEARCH, INNOVATION AND DEVELOPMENT HUB FOR LAGOS STATE AND NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT;

The Administration took great strides to achieve this goal by encouraging Academic Staff members to pursue researches in their fields of specialization with a view to making the outcomes of such researches available to the Industries and Governments for national economic growth. The Administration was also poised at making research and innovation culture, skills and management a priority by providing modern facilities and state of the art research equipment in specialised research Centres for cutting edge scientific and technological researches. In the pursuit of this strategic goals, the Administration has achieved the following in the last one year:

instituted a Five Million Naira (N5m) Research Grant for academic staff in the University;

LASU retained Best State University status and the 5th Overall position in Nigeria by AD-Scientific



#### LASU School of Transport Research Team won Volvo SEK 100,000 Research Grant



\* Two Research Teams in the University won TETFund 2020 National Research Fund (NRF) Grant to the tune of Sixty-six Million, Eight Hundred Thousand Naira (N66,800,000.00);





three senior academic staff members of the University won a cumulative research grant in the sum of Nine Million Naira awarded by the Lagos State Science and Research Innovation Council (LASRIC);



successfully organized a research ethics workshop and Research & Innovation Fair, the 4th in the series.















facilitated deployment of internet across the Campuses and plans are underway to improve on physical facilities.





facilitated the commencement of construction of Technology Hub for staff and students of the University by the Lagos State Government under



under the revered leadership of Prof. Ibiyemi Ibilola OLATUNJI-BELLO, mni, LASU applied and obtained full membership of the Ivory League of Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU).

#### 3.2.1 ICT Development

A strong Information and Communication Technology is pivotal to achieving breakthroughs in the field of research and innovation. Against this background, the Administration, through intentional and consistent investment in ICT, has achieved the following:

- 3.2.1.2 LASU has digitalized, virtually, all its operations and processes such that students may not have physical interaction with any Officer from the point of admission to post graduation.
- 3.2.1.3 the University has upgraded the security features of its certificate and embedded same with an Instant Verification Feature through which individuals and organizations can verify the authenticity of a LASU certificate immediately, from anywhere in the world.
- 3.2.1.4 in addition to these, the Administration also has other achievements in the area of ICT, which includes:

local development and installation of Plagiarism Checker (LASUGetItRight) in the University; installation of Remote Lecture room, lecture recording studios and smart classroom in the Postgraduate Schools;

installation of thesis repository management Centre in the Postgraduate School; commencement of automation of issuance of matriculation number in the Postgraduate School; commencement of online clearance and result uploading portal in the Postgraduate School; introduction of digital forensic training with participants from multinationals and other sectors; introduction of a course in cyber policing;

introduction of Senate decision extracts management system;

introduction of e-Senate file management with access for all members;

automation of all diploma programmes with result portal in the University;

digitalization of all University's records from 1985 - 2015;

digitalized our University Library making the resources accessible anywhere in the world.

invested hugely on library E-resources that staff and students can access anywhere.

introduction of Bimodal Teaching of GNS Courses. To ensure our students have more access to the GNS lectures and materials, Bimodal Teaching of the Courses was introduced to enable students access the course online and participate in weekly Quiz.

#### 3.3.5 Security

The security of lives and property is not negotiable and has been identified as germane to the Administration's success. Consequently, the Administration embarked on the following projects to enhance security of lives and property in the various Campuses of the University:

strengthened the Security Committee for enhanced performance

revamped the Security apparatus of the University with the appointment of a new Chief Security Officer, capacity development, logistics enhancement and engagement of the service of a private security outfit to boost logistic requirements





procured and commissioned five new motorbikes for enhanced performance

acquisition of ten (10) new body scanners for prompt detection of likely security threats training of our Operatives on Fire Fighting and Civility/Social Behavior for effective discharge of Security duties.

## 4.0 GOAL 4: TO IMPROVE INTERNAL GENERATION OF REVENUE WITH THE AIM OF ACHIEVING FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY OF THE UNIVERSITY

Funding has remained an albatross to most tertiary Institutions in Nigeria inhibiting their efficiency and fulfilment of their mandates – teaching, researching and Community services. With this understanding and awareness of the need to enhance the financial capability of the University, the Professor OLATUNJI-BELLO's led Administration is poised at harnessing the potentials of the University and maximizing their derivable benefits to enhance its internally generated revenue (IGR). The Administration is equally plugging identifiable drain pipes to the resources of the University and consistently quality assuring its processes to avoid wastages.

#### The strides taken in this regard includes:

resuscitation and standardization of Part-Time Degree Programmes as well as reinvigoration of the Open and Distant Learning and Research Institute (ODLRI)

repositioned the LASU Consult and LASU Ventures for optimal and effective performances to improve the Internally Generated Revenue of the University

created opportunities for yet-to-graduate Part-Time Students from the closed external Campuses to write mop-up examinations and get cleared for graduation after satisfying necessary conditions automating all processes of the University to avoid leakages and improve revenue collection commenced new academic programmes and established new frontiers of knowledge

# 5.0 GOAL 5: TO PROMOTE THE WELFARE OF ALL STAFF AND STUDENTS IN THE UNIVERSITY

For Professor Ibiyemi OLATUNJI-BELLO, welfare of staff and students is nonnegotiable. Driven by the passion to encourage motivation and reward system culminating into optimal performances. The Administration believe in promotion of serene ambience where every member of the University Community has the sense of belonging and responsibility. Among the multitude accomplishments in this respect are:

created enabling environment for our Staff and Students of the University to win grants and scholarships worth thousands of dollars

refurbished and furnished several Lecturer offices including provision of air-conditioners and standing fans where necessary.

the Administration created job opportunities for unprecedented number of Youths whose potentials had remained unexplored;

promotion of staff as and when due without compromising qualities is hallmark to prevalent industrial harmony in the University and it entrenches commitment as well as loyalty to institutional development. A total of 128 Academic Staff and 142 Senior Non-Academic Staff have enjoyed promotion as at September, 2022. The Administration restored the confidence of Staff in the system leading to stability and unhindered academic activities in the University.

facilitated the payment of all outstanding allowances and benefits which had hitherto resulted into agitations and restiveness. The differential adjustments in staff salaries, the Earned Allowances which had been outstanding for over ten (10) years, arrears on promotion of Staff were among the outstanding payments made.

sponsored an unprecedented number of staff members on local and international trainings and conferences towards building their capacity for improved service delivery. Precisely, two hundred and nine (209) Staff benefitted from sponsorship for local trainings/conferences while twentyeight (28) from international. 31

organized in-house trainings for members of the University Management, other functionaries of the University and some categories of Staff members















consistent and prompt payment of salaries on or before 23rd of each month, introduction of free medical check-up for every staff on their birthdays, activated the Lagos State Health Scheme in the University;

prompt payment of 30% of basic salary as end of year 2021 bonus; amongst others.

payment of all outstanding monthly check-off dues to Cooperative Societies in the University to enable them operate optimally

obtained approval for Y2022 budget with increased subvention;

several staff of the University have been recognized and honoured with national appointments for greater services to the nation. The beneficiaries include:

facilitated the donation of two (2) transit buses for the Students Union by the Lagos State Government; facilitated the donations of buildings, vehicles, equipment and books by private individuals and organizations











provision of enabling environment and policies to encourage LASU students participate and winning of local and international competitions.
